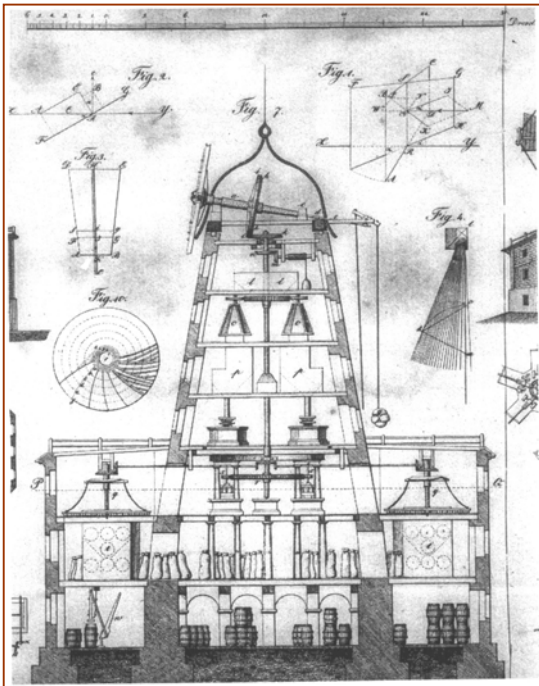

Fridr. Ganzel and Friedr. Wulff two very talented young students of Beuth's Gewerbeschule at Berlin, travelled in 1827/28 to America to “study” the milling techniques and machinery. Their journey was sponsored by the Prussian Government and the Verein zur Beförderung des Gewerbfließes in Berlin. After their return, all these information and new ideas built the foundation of a new prospering industry. Some of the material in this book has never been published before. It highlights the industrial revolution, were the increased number of new build modern wind- and watermills went parallel to the development of “Dampfmühlen”, mills driven by steam engines.
